Who does Jesus care about?

Jesus cares about everyone.

ACTIVITY: MEMORY VERSE REVIEW

WHAT YOU NEED: NO SUPPLIES NEEDED

What You Do:

- SAY: Let's practice our memory verse together.
- SAY: ‘How wide (stretch arms out wide) and long (stretch arms forward) and high (reach arms up) and deep (crouch down low) is the love of Christ. (Hug yourself.) Ephesians 3:18.” (Open hands like a book.)
- SAY: Let's try to figure out some things that fit each part of this verse!
- DO: Ask your child to give an example of something that is super wide, something that is super long, something that is super high, and something that is super deep. If they can't think of something, you can help prompt them to come up with something by giving them examples.
- SAY: Now, I'm going to ask you about each part of the memory verse. You're going to answer by saying “it's Wider/longer/higher/deeper than the object you told me. For example, when I ask, “How wide is the love of Christ?” you'll say, “Wider than *name whatever they said is super wide.*!” Are you ready?
- DO: Ask your child about each part of the verse (How Wide/Long/High/Deep is the love of Christ?). You may have to help your child remember the examples they gave.



ACTIVITY: ZACCHAEUS DRAWING

WHAT YOU NEED: PAPER, CRAYONS

What You Do:

- SAY: In this week's Bible story, you learned about a little man named Zacchaeus who was a tax collector. Tax collectors often did bad things back then. But, he wanted to see Jesus so bad that he climbed a tree just so he could see Jesus over the crowds! When Jesus saw him, instead of being mad at him, Jesus wanted to eat dinner with Zacchaeus at his house! This shows how Jesus cares about everyone, no matter what!
- SAY: Let's try to imagine that we are Zacchaeus. Let's draw a picture of what happened that day. First, let's draw Jesus teaching a bunch of people
- DO: Help your child draw a small picture of Jesus and a group of people. It doesn't have to be perfect, but make sure to leave room for the rest of the picture.
- SAY: Now, let's draw a tree on the other side of the people.
- SAY: Now, imagine that you are Zacchaeus. You're too short to see Jesus over all the people, so you have to climb the tree to see him! Draw yourself on top of the tree!
- SAY: Do you think that Jesus felt anger because of all the bad things Zacchaeus did, or love because Zacchaeus wanted to see him? Love, of course! Now, let's draw hearts above Jesus to represent how much Jesus cares for you!
