What You Do:


ASK:


- How do you know you can trust God?
- What do you think it means to trust God with something you can't see or control?
- When you're having a hard time trusting God, what can you do? Who can you talk to?
- What would you tell someone who doesn't believe God exists?

PRAYER

Dear God,

Thank You for the amazing world You've created and all the ways it shows us Your goodness, Your creativity, and Your love. Help us to trust You this week no matter what comes our way. ACTIVITY: CREATION WALK AND TALK WHAT YOU NEED: BIBLE

What You Do:

- SAY: Today we're going to take a few minutes to think about how God made the world—and how we can trust Him. Ready to go on a Creation Walk? Let's think about when the world began. The Bible says in Genesis 1 that God created everything—light, sky, land, animals, and people. Everything He made was good. What do you think the world looked like when God first made it?
- Go on a Creation Walk (Outside or at a window).
- SAY (as you walk): "Let's thank God for what we see."
- Point out things as you walk. Encourage your child to take turns thanking God too. Examples:
 - "Thank You, God, for the sky."
 - "Thank You for animals and trees."
 - "Thank You for making people and families."
- ASK: "What's something around us that reminds you how powerful God is?" "What does this tell you about what kind of Creator God is?"
- SAY: In Genesis 3, something sad happened.
 Adam and Eve chose not to listen to God. That brought sin and brokenness into the perfect world. But God still loved them and had a plan to fix everything through Jesus.
- Tell your child a quick story about a time you had to trust God. For example: "I remember when I wasn't sure about what to do in [situation]. I had to pray and trust that God would take care of me, even when I was nervous.
- Draw your favorite thing God created, and write one way you want to trust Him more this week.
