ACTIVITY: DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

WHAT YOU NEED: NO SUPPLIES NEEDED

What You Do:

ASK:

- What's the best gift you've been given?
- If Jesus is the greatest gift, what makes Him different from every other gift you've ever gotten
- How does God giving you Jesus show His love for you?
- How could you "pass on" this gift to someone else this Christmas?

ACTIVITY: GOOD NEWS CARDS

WHAT YOU NEED: PAPER, MARKERS, TAPE, STICKERS (OPTIONAL), ENVELOPES (OPTIONAL)

What You Do:

- **SAY:** When the shepherds saw baby Jesus, the Bible says they went and told everyone what they had seen and heard. They didn't keep the good news to themselves! Today, we're going to make Good News Cards to share Jesus' love with others.
- Read or summarize Luke 2:15–20.
- Have your child fold the paper in half to make a card.
- Have them draw one of these on the front:
 - A star
 - A manger
 - Baby Jesus
 - Angels or shepherds
- Inside the card, write one of these messages (or in their own words):
 - "Jesus is born! That is good news!"
 - "God loves you. Jesus came for you."
 - "Jesus brings joy to everyone."
 - Add the verse (optional): Luke 2:11 – "Today a Savior has been born."
- Have your child think of one or two people they can give a card to:
 - A friend, A grandparent, A neighbor, A teacher, or Someone who might need encouragement
- Write the person's name on the back of the card and pray for them together.
- Have your child practice saying: "I made this card to tell you that Jesus loves you and He was born for us."
- Remind them: Sharing Jesus doesn't have to be perfect—just loving and kind
