ACTIVITY: DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

WHAT YOU NEED: NO SUPPLIES NEEDED

What You Do:

ASK:

- When you have questions about God, who can you ask?
- What if you don’t get answers to the questions you have—what can you do?
- What truths do you know about God? How can knowing these truths help you while you wait to find answers to questions you may have?
- What do you do when you have questions about God that don’t really have answers?

PRAYER

Dear God,

Thank you for loving us even though we do not know everything. You know that we have tons of questions about you and your word. You will one day answer all of the questions that we have! Even though we do not have all of the answers yet, remind us that it’s okay to not know everything. Make us even more curious to learn about you and your word every single day! In Jesus’ name, Amen.



ACTIVITY: QUESTION JAR

WHAT YOU NEED: JAR/CUP/BOX (OR ANYTHING SIMILAR YOUR CHILD CAN DECORATE), SLIPS OF PAPER, WRITING UTENCILS, COLORING SUPPLIES

What You Do:

- **SAY:** In this week’s Bible story (Acts 8:26-40), we read about how Philip met a man from Ethiopia. This man was reading the Bible but had no clue what the passage meant! When Philip approached the man, the man asked him what the passage was about. He has a question for God that he did not know how to answer! Philip explained that what he was reading was about Jesus!
- **SAY:** God was not upset with this man for not understanding his word. Instead of being mad at him, God sent Philip to answer this man’s question! If God will answer a stranger’s question like that, don’t you think he wants to answer your questions, too?
- **SAY:** Let’s come up with a way to write down the questions we have for God. Let’s make a Question Jar/Box/etc. This Jar will be something we can put the questions we have for God in. Let’s see if we can decorate it!
- **DO:** Take some time to decorate your Jar/Box/etc. with your child.
- **SAY:** Now, let’s both come up with some questions we have for/about God. Maybe you’re confused about why God is letting something happen. Or maybe you just want to know more about a certain Bible story! Let’s both write down some questions and put them in the Question Jar/Box/etc.
- **DO:** Come up with some questions with your child. Do your own research on some of the questions to see if you can provide some answers at a later time!
