ACTIVITY: MEMORY VERSE MOTIONS

WHAT YOU NEED: NO SUPPLIES NEEDED

What You Do:

- SAY: Let’s learn our memory verse together.
- SAY: Our memory verse is Matthew 6:10. It says, “Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.” To start, repeat after me. “Your kingdom come... your will be done... on earth... as it is in heaven... Matthew... 6:10.” Awesome job!
- DO: Repeat this a few times to familiarize your child with the words.
- SAY: Now, let’s learn some motions to go with the verse so that we can remember it easier! You are going to repeat after me just like we did the first time. Are you ready?
- SAY: ‘Your kingdom come (point up), your will be done (hold hands out, palms up), on earth (point down) as it is in heaven’ (point up). Matthew 6:10 (open hands like a book).”
- DO: Repeat this until your child can do it on their own.
- SAY: Awesome job! This verse tells us about God’s kingdom, Heaven! All month, you are going to be learning about God’s kingdom at church!



ACTIVITY: THE KINGDOM TREE

WHAT YOU NEED: PAPER, COLORING SUPPLIES

What You Do:

- SAY: In this week’s lesson, you learned how the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed. Do you remember how big a mustard seed is?
- DO: Give your child the chance to answer. A mustard seed is incredibly small.
- SAY: The thing about a mustard seed is that it starts out super small, but grows into a plant with very large leaves. Just like the seed, the kingdom of God started with a small number of people in a room. Now, it spans 2.6 billion people, not counting all of the Christians who have already gone to heaven.
- SAY: Let’s use this image to frame a prayer. Let’s draw a large tree on this paper. Make sure that there is room underneath the leaves to draw.
- SAY: Now that we have the tree drawn, that tree is going to represent God’s kingdom. Jesus talked about how all the birds come to perch under its branches. This represents how everyone can come to God and find comfort.
- SAY: Underneath the leaves, let’s draw the people we would like to pray for. They could be friends, family, classmates, or anyone you’d like. Make sure you write their name by their picture so that we know who they are.
- SAY: Now that we’ve finished drawing the people we’d like to pray for, let’s take a moment and pray for all of these people.
