ACTIVITY: DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

WHAT YOU NEED: NO SUPPLIES NEEDED

What You Do:

ASK:

- Why do you think Jesus chose to appear to Saul in such a dramatic way (a blinding light and speaking voice) instead of in a quieter way, like a dream?
- When Jesus told Ananias to go to Saul, Ananias argued at first. Why was it so hard for him to believe Saul could change?
- Right after Saul could see again, he immediately began preaching about Jesus. Why do you think Saul didn’t hesitate or wait?
- Why do you think God didn’t just fix Saul instantly, but instead used Ananias—a regular Jesus-follower—to be part of Saul’s healing?
- After Saul’s transformation, the church continued to grow. How did Saul’s new mission help spread the message of Jesus even further?



ACTIVITY: ONWARD TO DAMASCUS!

WHAT YOU NEED: BLINDFOLD

What You Do:

- SAY: In this week’s Bible story (Acts 9:1-31), we read about Saul, who is a Pharisee, seeing Jesus with his own eyes and then going blind! When Saul followed what Jesus told him and went to Damascus, he met Ananias, received Christ as Lord and Savior, and then received his sight back. This was an incredible moment that changed not only Saul’s life, but the entire church as well! Saul went on to be a great preacher who shared the Gospel with many people!
- SAY: Let’s play a game to put ourselves in Saul’s shoes. When Jesus appeared to Saul, Saul went blind. Even with no eyesight, he had to get his friends to help him make his way all the way to Damascus!
- SAY: In this game, you’re going to pretend to be Saul after he met Jesus. You’ll use this blindfold to pretend you went blind. I am going to tell you somewhere in our house you have to go to. Your job is to make your way there with no eyesight! Don’t worry, I’ll be right behind you to make sure you do not get hurt. Are you ready?
- DO: Name a room or object in your house (i.e., bedroom, kitchen, refrigerator, coffee table). Your child then has to make it there with as little assistance as possible. If you feel that your child is about to run into something or get hurt, intervene to keep them safe.
